The OECD and the European Commission are promoting active participation of citizens and civil society in the implementation of Cohesion Policy funds. The OECD is currently supporting six pilots: Regione Emilia-Romagna in Italy, Regional Ministry of Cantabria in Spain, GZM Metropolis in Poland, Municipality of Ramnicu Valcea in Romania, Muncipality of Banska Bystrica in Slovakia, and the South Muntenia Regional Development Agency in Romania.

DELIBERATIVE DEMOCRACY IN THE BASQUE COUNTRY (virtual)

Thursday 8 June, <u>3.00 - 4.30 PM</u>

The OECD and Arantzazulab have been collaborating in the <u>design and implementation of the first representative deliberative process in Tolosa</u> (Gipuzkoa region, Basque Country in Spain) to help the City Council better address the mental health and wellbeing of its residents. The aim of this cooperation is to experiment on a small scale in order to learn, to generate knowledge, to disseminate and to be able to establish the conditions for institutionalising deliberative democracy in the Basque country.

In this session, Arantzazulab and the OECD will share their learnings from implementing two deliberative processes and invite participants to reflect on the conditions needed to promote a systemic approach to deliberative democracy.
